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PHA Supports Legislation to Increase Medicaid Reimbursement Rates, Improve Access to In-Home Care

"The Pennsylvania Homecare Association thanks Representative Jim Struzzi (R-Indiana) for championing legislation to increase the availability of personal assistance services across Pennsylvania.

"HB 2563 will increase Medicaid reimbursement rates to support an average direct care worker wage of \$15/hour, giving providers the ability to better compete for qualified in-home caregivers. Massive workforce shortages due to chronic underfunding of these services have threatened access to care, and this bill will help to support homecare providers in offering these vital, life-sustaining services to so many Pennsylvanians in need.

"Today more than 115,000 Pennsylvanians are eligible to receive home and community-based services through Pennsylvania's Community HealthChoices program. Enrollment in the program has increased significantly in recent years, as more Pennsylvanians than ever before want to age and receive care in the safety and dignity of their own homes and communities.

"PHA looks forward to working with Representative Struzzi and all legislators to help advance this critical legislation. The model of care is changing, and now is the time to invest in home care.
