

Seniors Deserve to Stay at Home

Permit Presumptive Eligibility



ISSUE

It is no surprise that home is where everyone wants to be. Even government officials agree that home-based care is a win-win for the state budget and individuals who need long-term services and supports.

Yet, the door to in-home care is still closed to some seniors and adults with disabilities due to stringent and outdated Medicaid rules that make it easier to go into a nursing home than to stay at home.

For individuals entering a nursing home, county assistance offices can quickly look at their financial information, determine that they are presumptively eligible and allow them to begin receiving care while the remainder of

the paperwork is processed. This expedited process is not available to those who wish to stay at home. To receive care at home, financial eligibility takes nearly six months before care can be delivered. Why is the more expensive care easier to access? Because back in the 1960s when Medicaid was established, nursing homes were the only option for care.

As Pennsylvania faces a growing elderly population and severe budget shortages, outdated Medicaid rules continue to favor more expensive care in a nursing home rather than staying in one's own home.



ACTION

SAMPLE LETTER

Dear Chairman Baker,
